From first-time Mini Campers to classic weeklong overnight sessions, Camp H.R. Erdman invites young people to unplug, explore the outdoors, build lifelong friendships, and discover who they are.



Specialty add-ons like Surf, Horse, Adventure, and `Ike Hawai`i immerse campers in ocean, land, and culture.

Evenings come alive with campfire skits, songs, s'mores, and the legendary Battle Challenge, where campers join one of four teams—Akau, Hema, Hikina, or Komohana—competing in spirited games that build teamwork and pride.



Leadership pathways such as Leaders in Training and Camp Assistants develop confidence and character, with many campers returning as counselors to carry the legacy forward.
